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Prerequisites: Hebrew I

<u>Purpose</u>: To learn the basic grammar, syntax, vocabulary, and structure of biblical Hebrew so that students can read biblical texts.

## **Requirements**

1) Attendance, homework, and informed class participation are required: 10% of your total grade. Absences can lower your grade at the discretion of the instructor.

2) Mid-Term Examination on March 11 and Final Examination on May 7 account for 40% of your grade (20% each, with extra weight given for improvement).

- 3) Weekly quizzes: 20% of total grade.
- 4) Oral Examination accounting for 30% of the total grade (May 1-May 12)
  - a) Students will choose a substantial passage and translate it. The instructor will then give an oral examination to each student to test for knowledge of forms, grammar, syntax, and vocabulary;
  - b) The instructor will ask each student to read aloud a Hebrew passage. Daily practice during the semester should prepare you sufficiently for this section.
